HIPS DON'T LIE

TEMPORARY EXHIBITION GALLERY

What is at play when today's artists and choreographers take up the forms and gestures of *baladi*, more commonly known as belly dancing?

Bringing together pieces by contemporary visual artists and choreographers, the exhibition approaches this dance as a multifarious and transnational material, a cultural space interlinked with geopolitical histories in numerous spheres: from popular entertainment (amateur or professional), to forms of ritualisation, to recent embodiments on the contemporary dance stage. The title "Hips Don't Lie" refers to a song by Shakira, the latest artist to date to appropriate the sexualised aura of this legendary dance.

"Belly dancing" is the name given by 19thcentury European and North American travellers to baladi, a form whose origins are unclear. The term has endured and evokes the imaginary worlds linked with this practice, which was a favourite subject for Orientalists in their depictions of mysterious regions and erotic fantasy. The works presented here critically shift these perceptions of the dance form and the attendant exoticism and sexual stigmatisation of those that practice it. Baladi also provides for a rich vein of gender analysis – it is interesting to note that it has historically also been practised by both women and men. In their artistic representations of this dance, the works in "Hips Don't Lie" dissolve and mock the stereotypes surrounding it and make light of our preconceptions.

In the auditorium of the Centre Pompidou Málaga, *Vidéodanse* presents a selection of films of works that have left their mark on French and international contemporary dance. The choreographers include Pina Bausch, Dominique Bagouet, Lucinda Childs, Anne Teresa de Keersmaeker, Merce Cunningham, Wim Vandekeybus and Radhouane El Meddeb.
